



How we make our plant choices

There are so many species of native plants that we have to choose from in this region, I did have to rein myself in to limit the bloom calendars to a manageable size! First and foremost, these species are native [or near-native if the list specifies] plants that attract pollinators. They are available, at least seasonally, from local nurseries. For many you may need to visit nurseries that specialize in native plants. They are all plants that I have personal experience with, either in garden or wildland settings.

The choices are also considered as a whole for the resources that they provide. For example, there is a balance between species with different growth forms (trees, shrubs, perennials, grasses, annuals, vines, etc.) such that collectively, they provide a varied vegetation structure that will provide for habitat needs of pollinators and other wildlife. Finally, these lists are organized as bloom calendars so that you can quickly see what color the flowers are, and when during the year you might expect them to bloom. Not only does this make for an interesting and beautiful garden for people, but it ensures that the plant selections are working together to provide nectar and pollen resources throughout the year for wildlife.


